## The public hearing was called to order by District Chairman DiBella at 5:30 PM

### Chairman DiBella read the following statement:

"This is a public hearing of The Metropolitan District. The District Board will receive public input on the proposed 2024 budget for The Metropolitan District, Water & Sewer Rates, and Revisions to Ordinances."

"On October 20, 2023, the 2024 proposed budget was made publicly available and posted on <u>www.themdc.org</u>. At its October 2<sup>ND</sup> 2023 meeting, the District Board referred the proposed budget to the Board of Finance. A final decision on the 2024 proposed budget, rates and ordinances has yet to be made. The District Board will consider and approve a final budget at its December 4, 2023 public meeting, and will take into account what is said at this hearing."

### John Mirtle, District Clerk, read the following into the record:

John Mirtle, District Clerk, read the public hearing guidelines.

### PUBLIC COMMENTS

Judy Allen, of West Hartford, read from the following written comments:

Good evening commissioners and thank you for receiving these comments.

Many of you may remember when the Raftelis report was first made public. It was a study pushed for by some towns meant to explore several options for collecting revenue for sewers.

The results were made public November 2, 2021. In it they report that an important component of an appropriate Customer Sewer Charge (CSC) is determining how charges will be collected. The district recovers the CSC on a per bill basis, which does not differentiate by any means based on customer type.

Discussions were had with District staff. It was determined that some differential based on customer type was appropriate, and basing the CSC on the size of a customer's sewer lateral and number of connections would work best for the District.

However at that time, reliable data was not available. District staff estimated the data would be available and reliable within the next 3 to 5 years.

The study then recommended that in the meantime, MDC could start a process of phasing in a new rate structure using customer meter size.

Quote: "Throughout the industry, the most common basis for differentiation of sewer fixed charges is on the size of customer's water meter."

Of concern to me is that I haven't heard any discussion about this since the report was made public although I brought this up last year.

If MDC is serious about making changes, the report says the District should be raising revenue using new calculations based on meter size by 22% each year. It's a large amount, especially for the District's largest customers, but begins the process of addressing the unfairness of the current method.

The report took years to complete involving MDC staff and at great cost to the MDC. I can only conclude that MDC agreed to the study to ameliorate the towns who were asking for change and are hoping it would eventually be forgotten.

The present continuation of the flat rate of \$9.00 for everyone regardless of type or size shows no progress. Smaller residential customers will continue to

disproportionally pay more for their Customer Sewer Charge and therefore their costs of sewers are greater.

Please report on the status of instituting a differential based on customer type as agreed to in this report.
