Subject; Indemnification for and Request for Reimbursement of Attorney Fees in the Matter of

the "Investigation Report Relating to Sandler and Mara, P.C. Invoices April 4, 2023" and

On May 22, 2023, I engaged Atty. Jamie Sullivan of the firm of Logan, Vance, Sullivan and Kores to represent me regarding the MDC Internal Audit Committee's charge that I had acted in violation of the District's Charter as advanced in its "Investigation Report Relating to Sandler and Mara, P.C. Invoices" of April 4, 2023, prepared by Attys. Patrick J. McHale and Jennifer L. Dixon of Kainen, Escalera and McHale, P.C.

The charge is unfounded and unsupported; the "Report" ignores, and the proceedings as documented by the Report and the Minutes and Transcripts of the Meetings, conceal exculpatory documentation readily available and known to the IAC's investigation team and; I am never informed that I am a subject of the investigation and as all discussion(s) on the charge are conducted in Executive Session(s) I am not provided with the ability to respond, my right to an open (public) forum never offered and my expectation for advice, non-conflicted counsel and representation as a Commissioner by the Office of District Counsel is blocked by the participation of that office in the Investigation itself.

The charge(s) are damaging to me personally and as a longstanding volunteer Commissioner in service to the District and my own community with an exemplary record of dedication and accomplishment in the execution of my duties as a member of the Commission and the various Committees I have served on for over 30 years.

It became necessary for me to be assisted by an attorney in attempting to understand the CT/FOIA and its impact on both the proceedings and the production of documentation and communications found in and "not found" in the Report. Having been charged with a "violation of the Charter" which I have been unable to understand to this day, and the fact that absolutely no documentation or communication has ever been presented either in the report or elsewhere that supports this charge. in fact, in my own review and investigation there are numerous documents and communications that actually prove the opposite, that in fact, there was no violation of the Charter.

My requests for documentation through my attorney have produced at least some of the documents I requested that were not produced at my request alone. These services will continue to be necessary as

we produce my final response to the Report and ask the District Board to provide a forum wherein the Report can be challenged along with the proceedings leading to its production.

I respectfully request that the issue of providing for the reimbursement of private Atty's fees provided in my defense in the matter of the "Investigation Report Relating to Invoices of Sandler and Mara, P.C." and its charge against me, be placed on the Agenda of the December 4, 2023, District Board Meeting.

VOTED: That the Board of Finance approves passage of the following resolution,

RESOLVED: There is established a Sewer Ad Valorem Tax Levy Stabilization Fund to

be accessed by the District solely for the purpose of reducing future ad valorem payments in an amount, if any, determined by the District Board, as recommended by the Board of Finance as part of the District's annual

budget process.

FURTHER RESOLVED:

Any and all proceeds realized by the District from the following legal proceedings shall fund the Sewer Ad Valorem Tax Levy Stabilization Fund. In addition, any other proceeds realized by the District, may be, with recommendation by the Board of Finance and with District Board

approval, applied to the Sewer Ad Valorem Tax Levy Stabilization Fund.
